SCRIPTURE STUDY AT FIRST UNITARIAN

How about exploring scriptures in a Unitarian Universalist manner? We'll start with a three-week class on the Book of Job, at 7:30 pm April 9, 16, and 23 (just after the 6:30 meditation, if you'd like to be mindful there first) in the Alcott Room. This is the first in a series offered by Rev. Tim on texts of world religions and other selections that might be considered scripture for some Unitarian Universalists. Then on April 30, same time, Phil Teitlebaum will offer more Bible study in a historical-critical approach. Rev. Tim is considering a Buddhist sutra and selections from the Bhagavad Gita for classes next year.
